MEC's largest legislative event was held at the Mississippi Trade Mart and the Mississippi State Capitol. Legislative briefings returned to the State Capitol, allowing attendees to meet with their legislators while there. The fourth annual Early Childhood Capitol Day was held on January 18, 2023. This year's inperson Capitol Day focused on the critical role that policy supports for childcare, postpartum healthcare, and early intervention services when it comes to strengthening Mississippi's workforce and the overall economy. **ECIC members Maury Hull and Debra McGee were among the speakers.**





In 2013, the state of Mississippi passed the Early Learning Collaborative Act of 2013. The established law collaborative delivery, state-funded pre-K program in which private or parochial schools, private child care centers, and/ or Head Start centers may join with a local public school district and compete state funds provide to prekindergarten services to a specific

community. The state pre-K tax credit was highlighted at Van Winkle Elementary School. Program Officer Todd Klunk and Tonya Ware attended along with a host of early childhood education advocates.

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion


